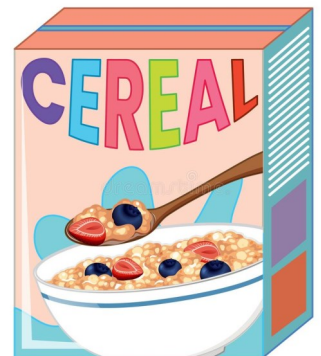
# Harvest Appeal
