It was called Children's Hour and was on between 5 and 6 o'clock every afternoon. The children considered the question: 'Are television channels as important as they once were?' 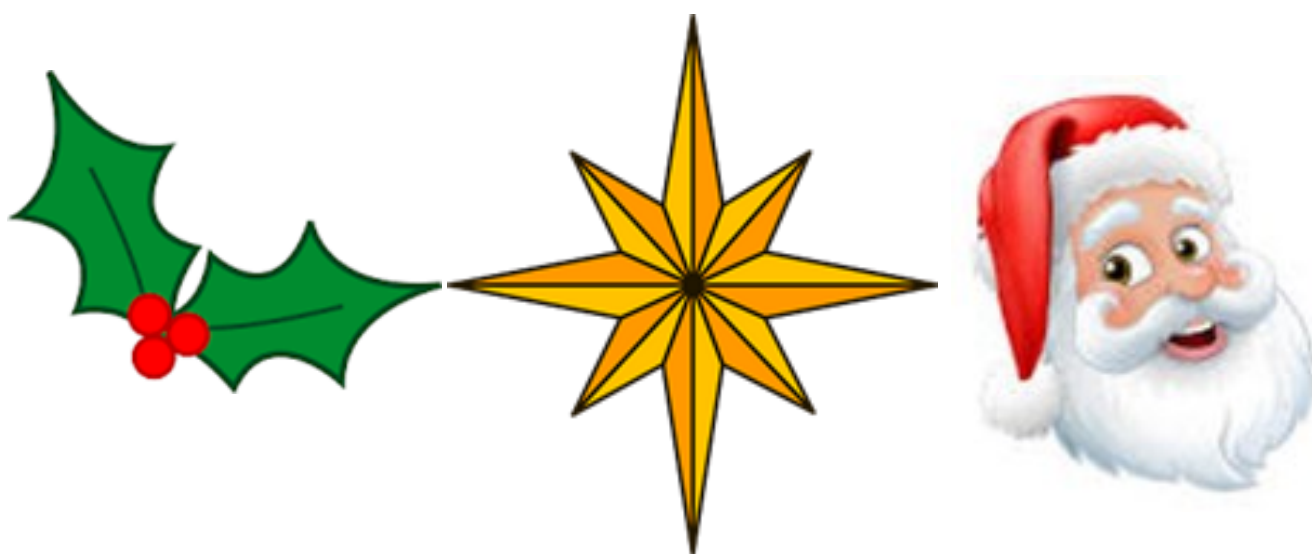
