
Just a reminder that the children should wear school shoes when in school uniform. Trainers should only be worn for PE days.

Reflection Time

"If you forgive others the wrongs that have done to you, your Father in heaven will also forgive you."

Matthew 6:14

This week in our worship, we thought about forgiving others as God has forgiven us. We heard the story from the New Testament of 'The Unforgiving Servant'. Joshua (a servant) was forgiven by the king and his debt wiped. However, another servant (Benjamin) owed Joshua a small amount of money. Joshua wasn't prepared to forgive him and clear his debt like the king had with his debt. We talked about being ready to show forgiveness to others in the same way that God shows forgiveness to us.
