Reflection Time

'Of every tree of the garden you may freely eat; but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat.'

Genesis 2: 15

This week in our worship, we looked at the story of Adam and Eve from the Old Testament. The serpent tempted Eve to eat from the tree they had been told not to touch.
