Reflection Time

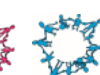
'For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son.'

A Request from School Council

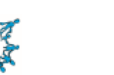
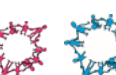
Our school council are wanting to replant the wildflower patch to help encourage wildlife. They are appealing to parents for any donations of wildflower seeds. Please see the letter below:

Dear parents and carers,



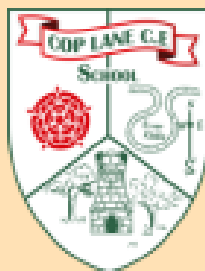
