John 18:15-27



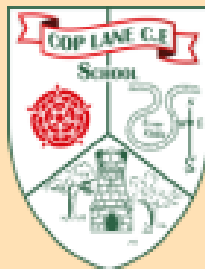
