## PTFA News

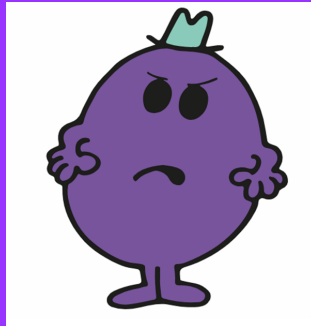



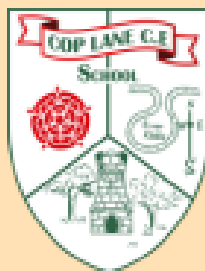
