A meeting of the Quality of Education committee (previously SEC) was held on the 31st January 2023 in school. The impact of the meeting was:

- Governors received three subject presentations from subject leaders to gain a deeper understanding into what Art and Design, Design Technology and Music looks like for a child at Cop Lane.
- Governors reviewed attendance data for Autumn 2022 and compared it to national primary school percentages.
- Governors received a report on the progress made so far with the current School Improvement Plan.

Governors lived out the school's Christian vision by widening their understanding of subjects taught and subject leader's ambition for every child through the curriculum intent.




