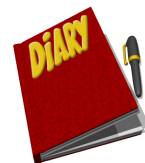

Now that the weather is cooler, donations of chocolate for the tombola and cakes for the cake stall would be greatly appreciated.




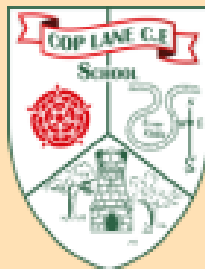
