Reflection Time

'Don't worry about anything, but in all your prayers, ask God for what you need, always asking him with a thankful heart. And God's peace, which is far beyond human understanding, will keep your hearts and minds safe.'

Philippians 4.6-7

This week in our worship, we have thought about finding peace. If we are worried, it is always best to speak to someone about it such as a parent, grandparent, teacher, friend or someone else we trust. Talking helps to get the problem back to its actual size rather than the size it becomes when we worry about it all the time. Worrying magnifies a problem. God's peace can help us when we get nervous or frightened.

PSHE Curriculum including relationships, health and sex education

Over the half term holiday, Gillian Keegan (Education Secretary) issued an update to schools to outline that schools can and should share curriculum materials with parents in relation to materials used to teach relationships, sex and health education.

At Cop Lane in 2020 to help prepare for the statutory changes, the revised curriculum/ policy did undergo a consultation with school staff, the governing board and to parents. All of our curriculum overviews etc can be found within our policy here:
