Reflection Time

Genesis 2:15

This week in our worship, we thought about trusting God to help us look after the Earth and our global neighbours. We heard the starfish story, which showed that small actions can make a difference. We then thought about our global neighbours and how climate change is affecting some countries more than others. For example, increase in flooding/ temperatures, which can affect people's livelihoods and food supplies. We talked about how small changes can lead to change. For example, turning lights off/walking or cycling rather than using the car. This would ensure less emissions, which would help towards reducing climate change. The children then thought about small changes they could make.
