This week in our worship we looked at how to be good global neighbours. We heard about Gideon and Timothy from Ghana, who had been helped by the Development Action Association. The land that they farmed was sold to a third party to grow pineapples. The DAA supported them to find new and alternative ways to make a living by snail farming. This generates money for food and education. Whilst eating snails may seem strange to us, many people in countries such as France see them as a delicacy. We talked about how people are having to come up with new and intuitive ways of making a living due to other factors as well such as global warming. We can all make small changes that will make a difference to everyone.
