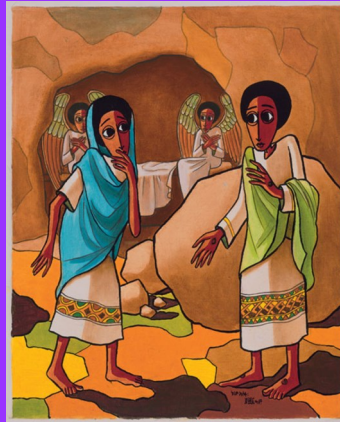


Reflection Time

Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life."

John 11:25-26

This week in our worship, our theme was the resurrection of Jesus. We looked at the art work below, which was created by Nebiyu Assefa, who is an Ethiopian artist. Mary Magdalene was a faithful friend of Jesus and had refused to leave Jesus, even when Jesus was put to death on a cross. She knew that his body had been laid in a tomb. It was the third day after it had all happened and Mary wanted to go to the tomb to be near Jesus once again. She was the first person that the risen Jesus appeared to, after he was raised to life again. She was the one that Jesus asked to go and tell others the joyful news.

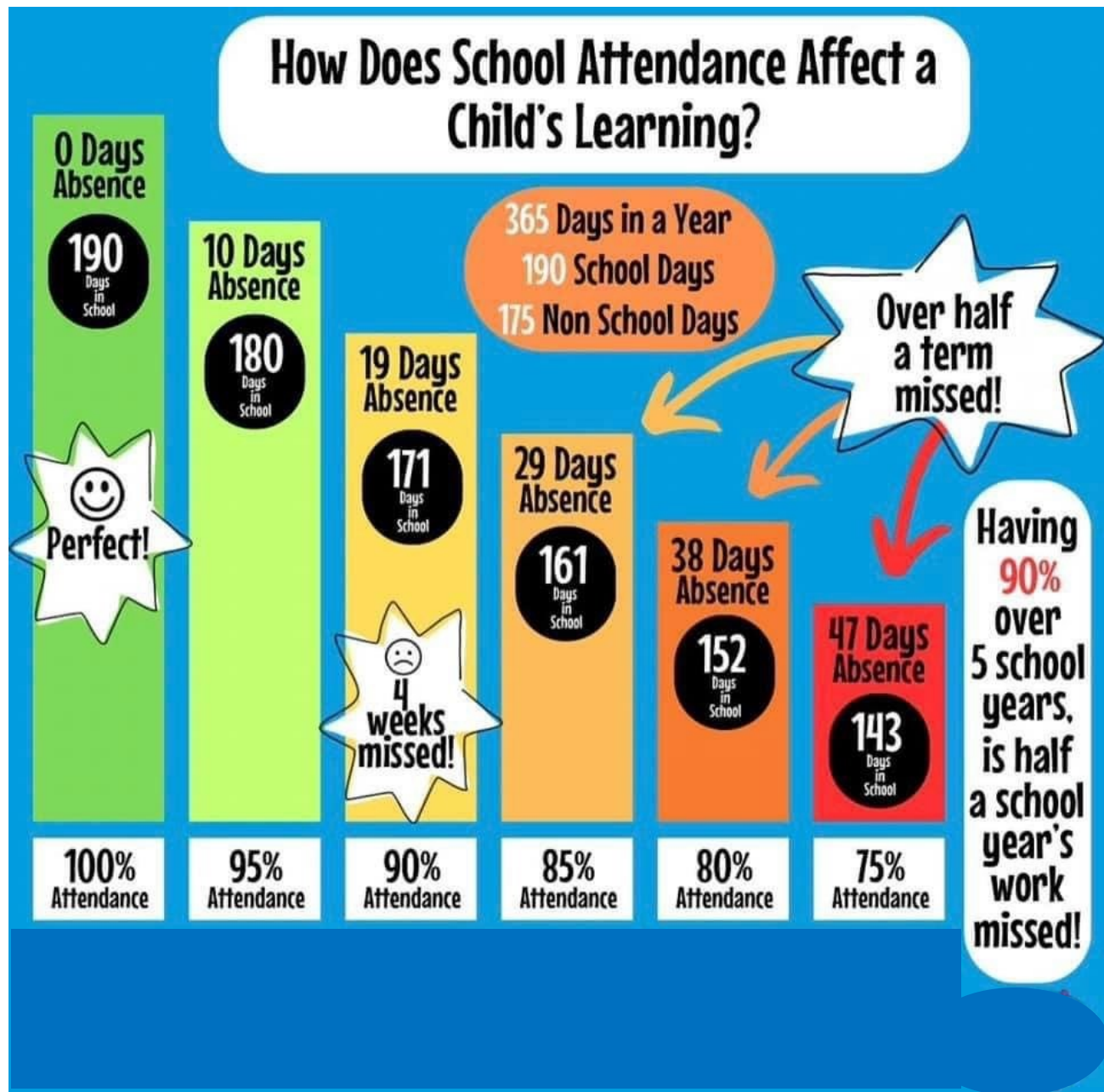
Polite Reminder—ClubClass Parents

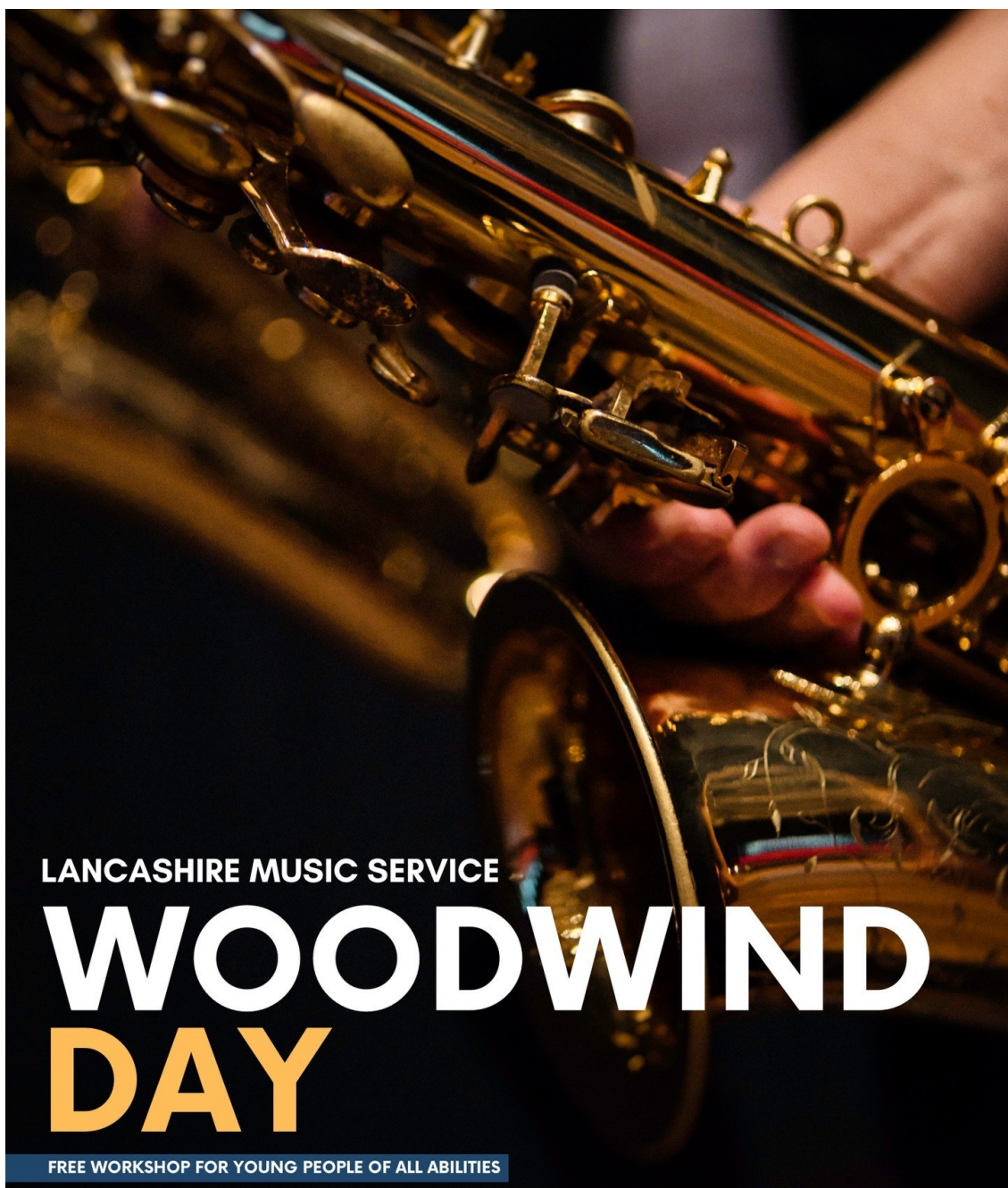
Please see the menu above for an upcoming Special Picnic lunch.
