Reflection Time

Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you!!" Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe.

John 20:24-31

This week in our worship, our theme was 'Hope in the Bible.'. We heard about the story of 'Doubting Thomas.'. Thomas wanted proof that Jesus was alive, and so Jesus, who had not yet returned to heaven met with him too and gave him proof he needed. But Jesus talks about a different kind of wisdom. A different kind of belief. He tells Thomas, "Blessed are those who have never seen me but still believe." Millions and millions of people since that time have believed that Jesus died and rose from the dead, even though they have never actually seen him with their own eyes. Because of their belief in Jesus, they have been challenged to make a difference. Like those first disciples, they have changed the world.






Reducing Illness Days



- When a child has a day off we must be notified by a parent or carer as to why. This can be a note or a telephone call. A child returning to school after an unexplained absence will be marked as unauthorised absence until we receive a valid explanation.
- If your child is saying they do not feel well and you are unsure about whether it warrants a day off please send them to school. If they are truly ill we will ring you.
- Use common sense when deciding whether or not your child is too ill to attend school. Ask yourself the following questions:
- Is my child well enough to do the activities of the school day?
- Does my child have a condition that could be passed on to other children or school
- Would I take a day off work if I had this condition?


