This week in our worship, our theme was 'remembrance'. We heard how the poppy became a symbol for this time of year. Red poppies grew on the battlefields during the First World War. As well as the traditional red poppy, we heard about the other colours of poppy that have been introduced in recent years. The purple poppy commemorates all the animals that contributed to the war effort. The black poppy is to remember all the black servicemen and women from countries around the world, who fought and died to bring peace. The white poppy is a symbol of peace with the message 'never again'.
