### Reflection Time

'When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy.'

Matthew 2:10

This week in worship, our theme was Epiphany. It marks the visit of the wise men to the baby Jesus. Each of the wise men brought gifts for the new baby. Gold was a gift fit for a king. Frankincense is a special kind of fragrance that is used by a priest. Myrrh is a sweet smelling liquid that is rubbed into the skin of someone who has died. The word 'epiphany' comes from a Greek word that means 'making known'. The birth of Jesus was the beginning of God making known who Jesus is and God's plan for the world.










The 'Voice for Change' group are meeting regularly and have some super ideas for continuing to support Pencott Valley Primary School, Uganda, this year. Details to follow.








# Every School Day Counts
