Reflection Time

'When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them.'

Acts 2:1-13

This week in worship, our theme was Pentecost. It marks the coming of the Holy Spirit to Jesus' disciples. Jesus promised his disciples that before he ascended to heaven, he would send the Holy Spirit to be with them forever. In the quietness, the disciples suddenly heard a sound, like a strong wind blowing towards them. They became aware that God's presence was with them and at the same time, they saw something incredible: flames or tongues of fire appeared and rested on each person's head, but without burning them. The fire was a sign of the Holy Spirit's presence and the different languages that they were speaking signified that they could go and tell people in other parts of the world about Jesus, too.

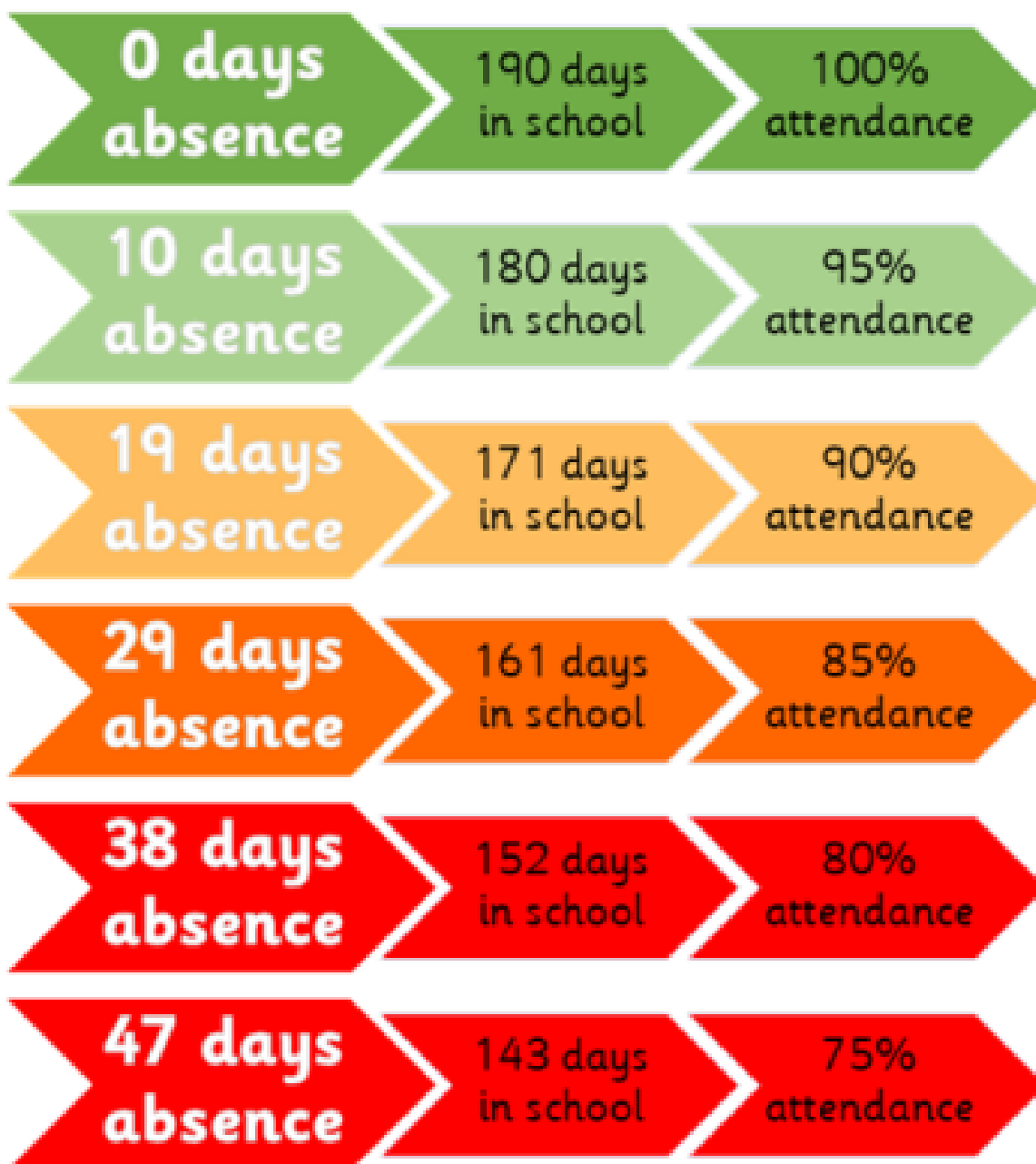
