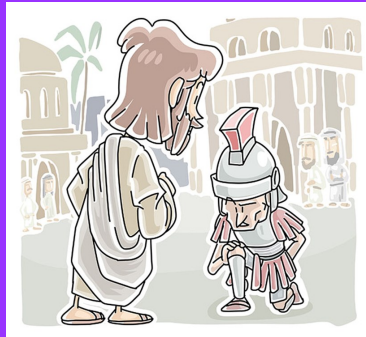


Reflection Time

Matthew 8:13
