Luke 8:15

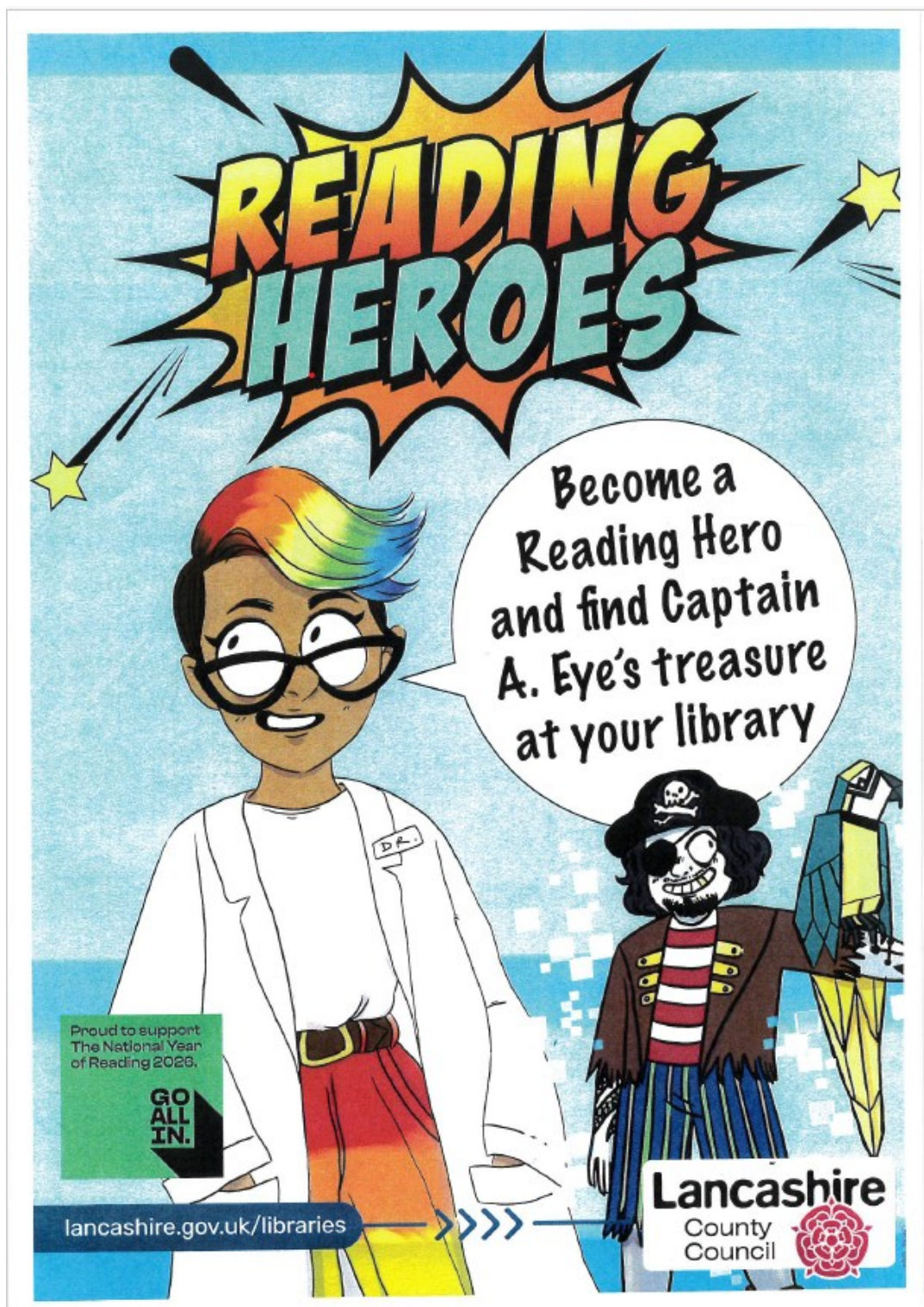
This week, Father Paul talked about the **Parable of the Sower**. In this story, Jesus tells us about seeds being scattered on different types of ground. Some seeds fall on the path, some on rocky ground, some among thorns, and some on good soil. The parable reminds us that **the seed is like God's word**, and the different soils represent the different ways people hear and respond to it. When the seed falls on **good soil**, it grows well and produces a rich harvest. This teaches us that when we listen carefully, take in good values, and try our best to live them out, we can grow into kind, thoughtful, resilient and thankful people.



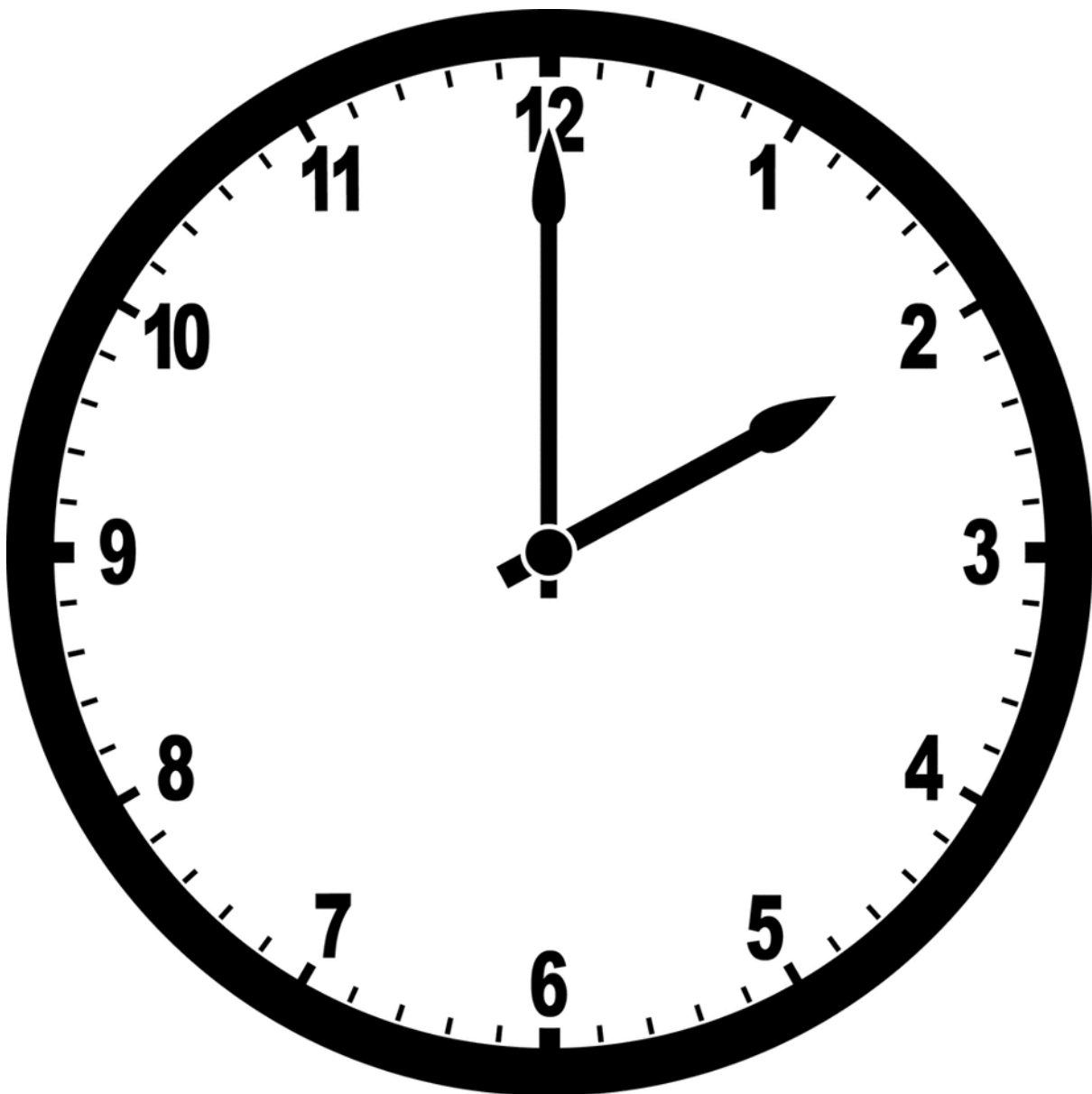

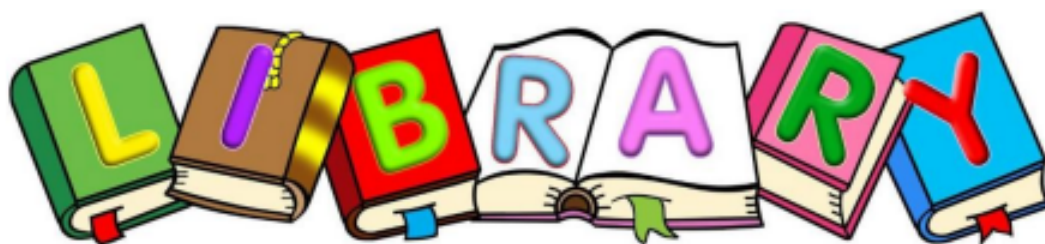
